MSUCOM Scholarship & Funding Information

Eligibility for all scholarships require the applicant to be enrolled and in good academic standing at MSUCOM.

To apply for all scholarships listed below, students must go to scholarships.msu.edu and fill out the general scholarship application as well as the MSUCOM Conditional Application.

Financial need will be determined by the Federal Government through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); Non-US Citizens will have their financial need determined based on their tuition rates.

We recommend hitting Ctrl + F to find scholarships that are most relevant to you. Try search terms such as: Canadian, underrepresented, financial need, rural health, your specialty choice, etc. Remember, you only submit one application for all College scholarships!

Please note: The year listed in the 'criteria' section refers to the year in which you are applying however awards are not disbursed until the following fall semester.

Loren O. Gettel Scholar Program in Rural Health	The Gettel Scholar Program provides a stipend for eligible medical students to attend the Annual Rural Health Conference in March of each year. The donor has requested that preference be given to students who have an expressed interest in primary care and a genuine interest/curiosity about rural health care. Medical Service Elective Fund	Only students enrolled in MSUCOM Medical Service Electives (MSE) and/or participating with a research project associated with a MSUCOM MSE. Awards may be used for, but not limited to, student financial assistance to offset MSE costs when financial need is documented; expenses, including travel, which are incurred as a result of the student's international research project associated with a MSUCOM MSE or while presenting a MSUCOM MSE research project at a recognized conference; and medications/supplies to be used on a MSUCOM MSPE
Neff Family Endowment for Health Policy Education	Students who want to learn and be active in the arena of health policy. Support programs that expose students to health policy and the state and national levels.
Rural Health Scholars	The Michigan Center for Rural Health encourages MSUCOM students interested in rural medicine to apply to become a Rural Health Scholar. This financial award covers the costs associated (Conference registration, mileage, lodging and meals) with attending the annual Michigan Rural Health Conference.
